Derrytresk Community Committee welcomes the draft LDP and the opportunity to comment on key aspects. We are a vibrant rural area, with an active community, and are fortunate to have a community centre that is enjoyed by residents and visitors of all ages.

Policy CT4 Dispersed Rural Communities

We welcome the retention of the Dispersed Rural Communities designation in the Draft Plan strategy. We also welcome the commitment at Para 4.46 that in preparing the Local Policies Plan consideration will be given to whether there are other locations in the District which could be defined as a DRC. We feel Derrytresk, with a growing school population, and a number of families seeking to locate to this area merits consideration

Para 4.10 table 2 Mid Ulster Settlement Hierarchy

We welcome the identification of Derrytresk as a new small settlement in the Draft Plan Strategy. We would ask that MUDC move to identify a settlement limit of Derrytresk asap in consultation with the local community.

Appendix 1 Housing Local Indicators and Economic Development Local Indicators Over Plan Period 2015-2030

We question the assumption of approximately 11 households within the proposed new settlement of Derrytresk. Until a settlement limit has been agreed it is difficult to identify how many households are contained within it.

Finally, we would welcome the opportunity for our community in Derrytresk to be involved in the more detailed consultation and planning as the strategy is further developed.
