Compliance with The Planning (Local Development Plan) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2015

This paper details the Councils compliance with the regulations contained within The Planning (Local Development Plan) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2015 in the preparation of its draft Plan Strategy.

For ease of reference each regulation followed by details of our compliance are set out below.

Preparation of the timetable

5. The council must, in the preparation of the timetable, consult the planning appeals commission and such of the consultation bodies as the council considers appropriate.

Regulation 5: Were the PAC or any other such consultation bodies consulted in preparation of the Timetable or revised Timetable?

- The PAC were consulted in relation to the original timetable on 8th February 2016 and agreed in a response on 25th February 2016 (appendix 1).
- Other key consultees were consulted on 8th, 9th and 19th February 2016 in respect of the original timetable (sample letter appendix 2).
- In relation to the 2018 revised timetable, the PAC were consulted on a draft revised timetable on 15th May 2018. The revised draft timetable did not materialize, therefore consultation on a further draft revised timetable was issued to the PAC on 27th September 2018 and agreed in a response on 4th October 2018 (appendix 3).
- Other consultees were consulted on 27th September 2018 (sample letter appendix 4).
- In relation to the 2020 revised timetable, the PAC were consulted on a draft revised timetable on 10th July 2020 and agreed in a response on 16th July 2020 (appendix 5).
- Other consultees were consulted on 10th July 2020 (sample letter appendix 6).
- The timetable will be kept under review, and it is likely to be revised further as the Draft Plan Strategy (DPS) moves towards adoption, in order to take into account any date set for public examination.

Content of the timetable

6.—(1) This paragraph applies where the council proposes to prepare a local development plan.

(2) The timetable must include indicative dates for-

(a) each stage of the preparation of the local development plan including indicative dates for-

(i) publication of the preferred options paper,

(ii) publication of the plan strategy and publication of the local policies plan, and

(iii) adoption of the plan strategy and adoption of the local policies plan; and

(b) the carrying out of the appraisal under sections 8(6)(a) and 9(7)(a) and the preparation

of the report on the findings of the appraisal under sections 8(6)(b) and 9(7)(b).

Regulation 6 - Does the timetable comply with this Regulation?

- Yes, the Local Development Plan (LDP) Timetable, and subsequent revisions, sets out the key stages and indicative timescales in the process to produce the MUDC Local Development Plan. The LDP Timetable includes indicative dates for:
 - publication of the preferred options paper (POP);
 - publication of the plan strategy (PS) and the local policies plan (LPP);
 - adoption of the PS and adoption of the LPP;
 - the carrying out the sustainability appraisal (SA) and preparation of the report on the findings.
- Hard copies of all timetables have been included in appendix 7
- The revised timetable can be found on our Council website:
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Agreement of the timetable

7.—(1) The timetable must be—

(a) approved by resolution of the council prior to submission to the Department for its agreement, and

(b) submitted to the Department.

(2) The Department must respond within four weeks of receipt of the timetable, unless it has, before the expiry of that period, notified the council that it requires more time to consider the timetable.

(3) If, before the end of the period specified in paragraph (2), the Department has failed to respond to the receipt by it of the timetable, it will be deemed to be agreed at the end of that period.

(4) Subject to paragraph (3) until such time as the Department agrees the timetable the council must not, in the preparation of a local development plan, take any steps under regulation 10 to advertise its preferred options paper.

(5) Paragraphs (1) to (4) apply to the revision of a timetable as they apply to its preparation.

Regulation 7: Has the timetable, and revised timetables been approved by resolution of Council prior to submission to the Department for its agreement?

• Yes. The original timetable was agreed by Council on 24th March 2016 (appendix 8).

- The Department were subsequently consulted on 25th March 2016 and responded by email on 20th April 2016 with suggestions for minor amendments to the timetable. These were considered and further consultation on the timetable with minor amendments was issued to DOE on 27th April 2016 who confirmed their agreement on 6th May 2016 (appendix 9).
- The 2018 revised timetable was agreed by Council on 25th October 2018 (appendix 10).
- The Department (Dfl) were subsequently consulted on 29th October 2018, and responded to agree the revised timetable on 21st November 2018 (appendix 11).
- The 2020 revised timetable was agreed by Council on 01st September 2020 (appendix 12).
- The Department were subsequently consulted on 11th September 2020, however the revised timetable issued to the Department on 11th September 2020 was not the correct version, and the correct version was issued on 05th November 2020. The Department responded to agree the revised timetable on 23rd November 2020 (appendix 13).
- The Department responded within four weeks of receipt of the timetable.
- The POP was advertised under Regulation 10 on 7th November 2016, after agreement from the Department.

Availability of the timetable

8.—(1) Where a timetable is agreed or deemed to be agreed under regulation 7, the council must—

(a) make a copy of the agreed timetable available for inspection during normal office hours at-

- (i) its principal offices, and
- (ii) such other places within its district as it considers appropriate;
- (b) give notice by local advertisement of the following-
- (i) that the timetable is available for inspection,
- (ii) the place and times at which it can be inspected; and
- (c) publish the timetable on its website.

Regulation 8: Has the Council made the agreed timetable available for inspection at its principal office and other places within the district considered appropriate?

- Yes. The agreed (revised) timetable is available for inspection Monday Friday 9am – 5pm at:
 - Magherafelt Office, 50 Ballyronan Rd, Magherafelt, Co. Derry, BT45 6EN
 - o Cookstown Office, Burn Road, Cookstown, BT80 8DT
 - o Dungannon Office, Circular Road, Dungannon, BT71 6DT

• Other locations within the district were considered, however given the locations of the 3 principal offices, in Magherafelt, Cookstown and Dungannon, which span across the district, we consider these provide adequate coverage and are accessible to both residents of Mid Ulster and any other persons.

Has the Council given notice by local advertisement that the timetable is available for inspection and the place and times at which it can be inspected? Has the Council published the timetable on its website?

- The original timetable was made available for inspection on 24th May 2016 during normal opening hours, Monday – Friday, 9am – 5pm at its three principal offices in Magherafelt, Cookstown and Dungannon.
- Notice was given by local advertisement in a range of publications on the weeks commencing 23rd & 30th May 2016 (appendix 14).
- The original timetable was published on the Council website on 10th May 2016 (appendix 15) and a website address linked to the timetable is provided within the press notice.
- The 2018 revised timetable was made available for inspection on 3rd December 2018, during normal opening hours, Monday Friday 9am 5pm at its three principal offices in Magherafelt, Cookstown and Dungannon.
- Notice was given by local advertisement in a range of publications on the weeks commencing 3rd & 10th December 2018 (appendix 16).
- The revised timetable was published on the Council's website on 30th November 2018 (appendix 17) and a website address linked to the timetable is provided within the press notice.
- The 2020 revised timetable was made available on 14th December 2020, during normal opening hours, Monday Friday 9am 5pm at its three principal offices in Magherafelt, Cookstown and Dungannon.
- Notice was given by local advertisement on the weeks commencing 14th and 21st December 2020 (appendix 18).
- The revised timetable was published on the Council's website on 14th December 2020 (appendix 19) and a website address linked to the timetable is provided within the press notice.

Has any revision to the timetable been in accordance with the requirements of Regulations 7 & 8?

• Yes. Details have been provided above under Regulation 7 and 8.

Preparation of the preferred options paper

9.—(1) Before a council complies with regulation 11, it must, for the purpose of generating alternative strategies and options, engage the consultation bodies.

(2) In preparing the preferred options paper the council must take into account any representation received from the consultation bodies.

Regulation 9: Has the council engaged the consultation bodies for the purpose of generating alternative strategies and options before publication of the POP?

- Yes. The Council engaged extensively with consultation bodies prior to the publication of the POP. Consultation bodies were consulted on 10/11th May 2016, and this included all of those listed as 'consultation bodies' under Regulation 2 of these LDP Regulations. Alternative strategies were considered including options which were published in the POP.
- A sample letter sent to consultation bodies seeking information/identification of issues pre-POP can be found at appendix 20.

Has the Council taken into account any representation received from the consultation bodies?

• Yes. The Council has taken account of all representations received from consultation bodies arising from engagement prior to the publication of the POP. Representations were recorded and detailed as they were received. Reponses were received from a range of consultees including utility providers, government departments and neighbouring councils.

Availability of the preferred options paper

10. Before a council prepares a development plan document it must—

(a) make the following documents available for inspection during normal office hours at the places referred to in paragraph (b)—

(i) a copy of the preferred options paper,

(ii) such supporting documents as in the opinion of the council are relevant to that paper, (iii) a document containing a statement indicating the period specified by the council under regulation 11(2) as the period within which representations on the preferred options paper may be made,

(iv) notice of the address to which representations are to be sent.

(b) the places referred to in paragraph (a) are—

(i) the council's principal offices, and

(ii) such other places within the council district as the council considers appropriate;

(c) send to the consultation bodies the information set out at paragraph (a);

(d) give notice by local advertisement of the following-

(i) the title of the local development plan,

(ii) a statement of the fact that the preferred options paper is available for inspection and the places and times at which it can be inspected,

(iii) a brief description of the content and purpose of the preferred options paper, and

(iv) details of how further information on the preferred options paper may be obtained; And

(e) publish on its website—

(i) the preferred options paper,

(ii) such supporting documents as in the opinion of the council are relevant to the

preferred options paper, and

(iii) the document mentioned in paragraph (a)(iii) and notice mentioned in paragraph (a)(iv).

Regulation 10 (a) & (b) - Has the Council complied?

- Yes. The POP and supporting documents were made available for inspection on 7th November 2016, for a 12 week consultation period, during normal office hours in the Councils principal offices in Dungannon, Cookstown and Magherafelt.
- The POP contained a statement indicating the period within which representations could be made and included notice of the address to which representations should be sent as well as details of the 12 week consultation period (appendix 21).

Regulation 10 (c) - Has the Council sent the information in paragraph (a) Regulation 10 to the consultation bodies?

- The consultation bodies (as defined at Regulation 2 of the LDP Regulations) were consulted on 22nd November 2016 (see appendix 22).
- A further set of consultation bodies were consulted on 12th September 2018 following legal advice on an error in the earlier consultation process (appendix 23). Consultation included notification of the availability of the POP and supporting documents for inspection with notice of period in which and the address to which representations should be sent.

Regulation 10 (d) - Has the Council complied?

- In accordance with Regulation 10 (d) notice was given by local press of; the title of the local development plan,
 - a statement of the fact that the preferred options paper is available for inspection and the places and times, at which it can be inspected,
 - $\circ\;$ a brief description of the content and purpose of the preferred options paper, and
 - \circ details of how further information on the preferred options paper may be obtained.
- Advertisements were placed in a range of publications on the weeks commencing, 24th & 31st October 2016 and, 7th &14th November 2016 (appendix 24).

Regulation 10 (e) - Has the Council complied?

- The POP was published online on 7th November 2016 in accordance with Regulation 10 (e) on our Council website.
- Along with publishing the POP online, supporting documents were also published as these formed part of the extensive preparatory work and data gathering the Council undertook in preparation for the publishing of the POP.

- The Regulation 10 Public Consultation Document Notice, containing a statement indicating the period within which representations could be made was also published online. It included notice of the address to which representations should be sent (Regulation 10 (a) (iii) and (iv)).
- All relevant POP documents can be found on our Council website.

Public consultation on the preferred options paper

11.—(1) Any person may make representations about a council's preferred options paper.

(2) Any such representations must be—

(a) made within a period which the council specifies, and

(b) sent to the address specified pursuant to regulation 10(a)(iv).

(3) The period referred to in paragraph (2)(a) must be a period of not less than 8 weeks or more than 12 weeks starting on the day on which the council complies with regulation 10(a).

(4) A council must take account of any representations made in accordance with paragraph (2) before it prepares a development plan document.

Regulation 11: Was the public consultation period for the POP between 8 and 12 weeks? Has the Council taken account of any representations made in accordance with paragraph (2) Regulation 11, before it prepares a development plan document?

- Yes, the public consultation on the POP ran for 12 weeks commencing on the 7th November 2016 (the date the POP was made available for inspection) and ending at 5.00pm on the 27th January 2017.
- The Council fully considered representations that were made during this 12week period for public consultation in accordance with Regulation 11 (2).
- The representations made are presented within the Preferred Options Paper Public Consultation Report Update that was published in January 2019. The purpose of this report is to provide a summary of responses received in relation to the Local Development Plan.
- A copy of the POP Public Consultation Report can be found on our Council website.

Form and content of a development plan document

12.—(1) A development plan document must contain—

(a) a title which must give the name of the council district for which the development plan document is prepared and indicate whether it is a plan strategy or a local policies plan,

and

(b) a sub-title which must indicate the date of the adoption of the development plan document.

(2) A development plan document must contain a reasoned justification of the policies contained in it.

(3) Those parts of a development plan document which comprise the policies of the development plan document and those parts which comprise the reasoned justification required by paragraph (2) must be readily distinguishable.

Regulation 12 (1): Does the Council comply?

• Yes, the title is, 'Local Development Plan 2030- Draft Plan Strategy'. The plan has not been adopted yet and therefore, no adoption date has been added as a sub-title. Once the plan has been adopted, a sub-title containing the date of adoption will be added.

Regulation 12 (2) - Does the Development Plan document contain a reasoned justification of the policies contained within it?

• Yes, each policy has justification and amplification text below the policy box providing the reasoning behind each policy.

Regulation 12 (3) - Are those parts of the development plan, which comprise the policies, and those parts, which comprise the reasoned justification readily distinguishable?

• Yes, each policy is contained in a coloured box that has a clear title, giving the policy reference and the title of the policy. Contained below this and clearly separated by the way of a title, is the justification and amplification text. Each policy and supporting text is contained within the relevant separate chapters and each paragraph is given a number for ease of reference.

Proposals map

13.—(1) A development plan document must contain a map or maps, (to be known as "the proposals map"), describing the policies and proposals set out in the development plan document so far as practicable to illustrate such policies or proposals spatially.

(2) The proposals map is to be sufficiently detailed so as to enable the location of proposals for the development and use of land to be identified.

(3) In the case of any contradiction between the written statement and any other document forming part of a local development plan, the written statement shall prevail.

Regulation 13: Does the development plan document contain a map or maps describing the policies and proposals set out in the development plan document so far as practicable to illustrate such policies or proposals spatially?

• Yes. There are a number of maps contained within the Draft Plan Strategy document which includes District Proposal Maps which accompany the document. The purpose of these maps is to illustrate the policies and proposals appropriately. They are sufficiently detailed to enable the identification of land.

Additional matters to be taken into account

14.—(1) The other matters that the council must take into account in preparing a local development plan are—

(a) the objectives of preventing major accidents and limiting the consequence of such accidents,

(b) the need—

(i) in the long term to maintain appropriate distances between establishments covered by the Directive and residential areas, buildings and areas of public use,

major transport routes as far as possible, recreational areas and areas of particular natural sensitivity or interest, and

(ii) in the case of existing establishments, for additional technical measures in accordance with Article 5 of the Directive so as not to increase the risks to people.(2) In this regulation—

(a) the Directive means Council Directive 96/82/EC on the control of major-accident hazards involving dangerous substances, and

(b) expressions used in paragraph (1) and in the Directive have the same meaning in that paragraph as in the Directive.

Regulation 14 – Has the Council complied?

- The Directive referred to above states that a 'major accident' shall mean an occurrence such as a major emission, fire, or explosion resulting from uncontrolled developments in the course of the operation of any establishment covered by this Directive, and leading to serious danger to human health and/or the environment, immediate or delayed, inside or outside the establishment, and involving one or more dangerous substances.
- An 'establishment` shall mean the whole area under the control of an operator where dangerous substances are present in one or more installations, including common or related infrastructures or activities.
- The objectives of preventing major accidents and limiting the consequence of such accidents will be aided by a number of policies proposed within our DPS. These include the General Principles Planning Policy – GP1 which is applicable to all development and requires that development is compatible with surrounding land uses and the amenity of neighbouring residents. It also requires that the existing road network can safely handle any extra traffic generated by development proposal. Further road safety and traffic considerations are outlined in the various other policies and specifically the transportation policies.
- In addition policies, CT2 and AFR1 make provision to site away from farm and/or forestry building where there are demonstrable health and safety reasons.
- A number of minerals policies adopt a precautionary approach, and note that particular attention will be given to the potential impact on human health and public safety. This includes Policy MIN 2 – Extraction and Processing of Hard Rock and Aggregates and Policy MIN 6 – Mines, Shafts and Adits which only facilitates development where it has been demonstrated that there are no health and safety risks due to land instability. Policy MIN 3 – Valuable Minerals and hydrocarbons notes that proposals will only accord with the Plan where there are no are no significant environmental impacts or significant risks to human health.
- In relation to flood risk, our strategy is to avoid development within the flood inundation area of a controlled reservoir unless it has been demonstrated that

appropriate controls and safeguards are in place. In our amplification to Policy FLD4 – Development in Proximity to Reservoirs, any flood risk assessment should consider the address the controlled and uncontrolled release of flood water from the reservoir and include an emergency evacuation plan that can demonstrate the safe access and egress for emergency services and people during times of flooding including the systemic failure of the reservoir retaining structure where appropriate.

- Our Urban Design and Housing in Settlements aim to create safe environments and deter crime.
- Policy RNW 1 Renewable Energy in relation to wind energy development, includes a requirement that proposal do not result in an unacceptable impact on roads rail or aviation safety; and significant harm to the safety or amenity of any sensitive receptors. In relation to energy from waste – incineration, key considerations include the impacts on human health and public safety.
- This list is not exhaustive. In addition, COMAH sites continue to exist and these
 will also be considered at Local Policies Plan. Distances between
 establishments covered by the Directive and residential areas, buildings and
 areas of public use, major transport routes so far as possible, recreational areas
 and areas of particular natural sensitivity or interest will also be a consideration
 for Local Policies Plan, as will, in the case of existing establishments the need
 for any additional technical measures in accordance with article 5 of the
 Directive so as not to increase the risk to people.
- In addition, the Council continue to consult the relevant authorities regarding development proposals that may impact on these sites who advise on appropriate distances between non-compatible uses and/or measures to be taken.

Availability of a development plan document

15. Before submitting a development plan document to the Department under section 10 the council must—

(a) make the following documents available for inspection during normal office hours at the places referred to in paragraph (b)—

(i) a copy of the development plan document,

(ii) a copy of the sustainability appraisal report under section 8(6)(b) or 9(7)(b), as the case may be,

(iii) such supporting documents as in the opinion of the council are relevant to the preparation of the local development plan,

(iv) a document containing a statement indicating the period within which

representations on the development plan document may be made, and

(v) notice of the address to which representations can be sent;

(b) the places referred to in paragraph (a) are—

(i) the council's principal offices, and

(ii) such other places within the council district as the council considers appropriate;

(c) send to the consultation bodies a copy of the documents set out in paragraph (a);

(d) give notice in the Belfast Gazette and by local advertisement of the following— (i) the title of the development plan document, and

(ii) a statement of the fact that the development plan document is available for inspection

and the places and times at which it can be inspected; and

(e) publish on its website—

(i) the development plan document,

(ii) such of the supporting documents as in the opinion of the council are relevant, and

(iii) the notice mentioned in paragraph (a)(iv).

Regulation 15 (a) & (b) – Has the Council complied?

- The Draft Plan Strategy (including proposals maps), SA/SEA Report, Equality Impact Screening Report, Rural Needs Impact Assessment and Habitats Regulations Assessment and the Regulation 15 Notice were made available for inspection from 22nd February 2019 until 4pm on 19th April 2019 at the 3 principal Council offices Magherafelt, Cookstown and Dungannon during normal opening times.
- The Regulation 15 Notice, indicated the period within which representations on the DPS could be made and the address to which they could be sent (appendix 25).
- Following a procedural error, a re-consultation period was launched for the Draft Plan Strategy. All documentation was made available for inspection at the 3 principal Council offices Magherafelt, Cookstown and Dungannon during normal opening times from 25th March 2020 for a period of 8 weeks until 5pm on 21st May 2020.
- The emergence of Covid-19 meant that this re-consultation period was extended until 5pm on 24th September 2020. Due to Covid-19, an appointment could be made to view the documentation by contacting the Planning Department directly
- See appendix 26 for the original Re-consultation Notice, the interim notification of extension, and the final notification of extension with closing date.

15 (c) - Has the Council sent a copy of the documents set out in paragraph (a) Regulation 15 to the consultation bodies?

- Yes, the Council sent a copy of the DPS to consultation bodies on 22nd February 2019, providing details of the consultation period, and the availability of all supporting documents including the SA/SEA report (appendix 27).
- Following a procedural error, a re-consultation period was launched for the Draft Plan Strategy. Consultation bodies were provided with details of the reconsultation period, and the availability of all supporting documents including the SA/SEA report on 12th March 2020 (appendix 28).
- The emergence of Covid-19 meant that this re-consultation period was extended until the 24th September 2020, and consultation bodies were provided with these details also on 15th July 2020 (appendix 29).

15 (d) - Has notice been given in the Belfast Gazette and by local advertising of:

- The title of the development plan document
- A statement of the fact that the development document is available for inspection and the places and times at which it can be inspected?
- Yes, notice was given in the Belfast Gazette and by local advertisement on the weeks commencing 17th and 24th February 2019 (appendix 30). The notice included the title of the development plan document *Mid Ulster District Council Local Development Plan 2030 Draft Plan Strategy* and a statement detailing that the DPS, and supporting documents detailed above in 15(a) were available for inspection, and the places and times at which they could be inspected.
- Due to the procedural error and the subsequent re-consultation period, notice was given in the Belfast Gazette and by local advertisements on the weeks commencing 9th and 16th March 2020 (appendix 31). The notice included all the details outlined in 15(a).
- Due to the emergence of Covid-19, this re-consultation period was extended until the 24th September 2020, and adverts were placed in a range of advertisements detailing the new closing date on weeks commencing 13th and 20th July 2020, and 31st July 2020 (appendix 32).

15 (e) Has the Council published on its website

- The development plan document
- Such supporting documents as in the opinion of the Council are relevant, and,
- The notice mentioned in paragraph (a)(iv) of Regulation 15?
- Yes, the DPS, the aforementioned supporting information, including details of when representations may be made and where they could be sent to, were all placed on the Council website at the same time as the local newspaper advertisement.

Public consultation on a development plan document

16.—(1) Any person may make representations about a development plan document.

(2) Any such representations must be-

(a) made within a period of 8 weeks starting on the day the council complies with regulation

15(d), and

(b) sent to the address specified pursuant to regulation 15(a)(v).

Regulation 16 – Has the Council complied?

• The DPS was advertised in the Belfast Gazette and by local advertisement on the weeks commencing 17th and 24th February 2019. See appendix 30.

- The public notice indicated that the DPS and supporting documents would be available for consideration from 22nd February 2019, for a period of 8 weeks, until 19th April 2019.
- Due to the procedural error a re-consultation period was launched for the DPS, and notice was given in the Belfast Gazette and by local advertisements on the weeks commencing 9th and 16th March 2020. See appendix 31.
- The public notice indicated that the DPS and supporting documents would be available for consideration from 25th March 2020, for a period of 8 weeks, until 21st May 2020.
- Following the emergence of Covid-19, the re-consultation period was extended until 24th September 2020. Adverts were placed in a range of advertisements detailing the new closing date on weeks commencing 13th and 20th July 2020, and 31st July 2020. See appendix 32.

Availability of representations on a development plan document 17.—(1) As soon as reasonably practicable after the expiry of the period referred to in regulation 16(2)(a) the council must— (a) make the following documents available for inspection at the places referred to in paragraph (b)—

(i) a copy of the representations,

- (ii) a document containing a statement indicating the time within which counter representations may be made, and
- (iii) notice of the address to which counter representations can be sent;

(b) the places referred to in paragraph (a) are—

(i) the council's principal offices,

(ii) such other places within the district of the council as the council considers appropriate;

(c) publish the representations on its website;

(d) give notice in the Belfast Gazette and by local advertisement of the fact that

representations are available for inspection and the places and times at which they can be inspected;

(e) notify the consultation bodies of the fact that representations are available for inspection and the places and times at which they can be inspected; and

(f) notify any person who has made (and not withdrawn) a representation in accordance with regulation 16(2) of those matters.

(2) A council need not comply with paragraph (1) if the representation is made after the period specified in regulation 16.

Regulation 17 -1 (a) & (b) Has the Council made the following available for inspection after the 8 week consultation period at its principals offices or other places within the district deemed appropriate:

- A copy of the representations
- A document containing a statement indicating the time within which counter representations may be made, and,
- Notice of the address to which counter representations can be sent?

- A document Regulation 17 notice detailing the period within which counter representations could be made and an address to which they could be sent was also made available for inspection at the same time (appendix 34).

17 -1 (c) Has the Council published the representations on its website?

- A copy of representations and the Regulation 17 notice outlined above, were made available to view online on the Councils website from 14th June 2019 (appendix 35).
- Following re-consultation, all new and updated representations were published online along with the original representations on the Councils website from 21st October 2020 (appendix 36).
- Representations can be found on our Council website.

17 -1 (d) has the Council given notice in the Belfast Gazette and by local advertisement of the fact that representations are available for inspection and the places and times at which they can be inspected?

- Yes, notice was provided within the Belfast Gazette and by local advertisement on the weeks commencing 10th & 17th June 2019, that the representations were available for inspection during normal office hours at its three principal offices in Magherafelt, Cookstown and Dungannon between 14th June 2019 and 9th August 2019 (appendix 37).
- Following the re-consultation, notice was provided within the Belfast Gazette and by local advertisement on the weeks commencing 12th and 19th October 2020, that the representations were available to view for inspection during the hours 9am – 5pm, Monday – Friday by appointment from Wednesday 21st October 2020 at the three principal Council offices in Magherafelt, Cookstown and Dungannon (appendix 38).

17 - 1(e) 7 (f) Notified Consultation bodies of the fact that representations are available for inspection and the places and times they can be inspected?

Notified any person who has made (and not withdrawn) a representation in accordance with regulation 16(2) of those matters?

- Yes, the Council notified consultation bodies on 11th June 2019, and any person who had made (and did not withdraw) a representation, of the fact that representations were available for inspection and the places and times at which they could be inspected (sample letter appendix 39).
- Following re-consultation, the Council notified consultation bodies on 16th October 2020 and any person who had made (and did not withdraw) a representation, of the fact that representations were available for inspection and the places and times at which they could be inspected (sample letter appendix 40).

Public consultation on site specific policy representations

18.—(1) Any person may make representations about a site specific policy representation (in regulations 17, 19 and this regulation referred to as "counter representations").

(2) Counter representations must be—

- Published this information on its website?
- A copy of counter representations were made available for inspection from 15th November 2019 at the Council's three principal offices in Magherafelt, Cookstown and Dungannon between the hours of 9am – 5pm. They were also published on the Council's website on the same date along with details of where and when hard copies could be inspected.
- Following re-consultation, a copy of counter representations (including new counter representations received during re-consultation) were published on the Council's website on the 04th January 2021. Hard copies of all counter representation had been placed in our three principal offices in Magherafelt, Cookstown and Dungannon. However, in light of Covid-19 restrictions, counter representations were not available for public inspection as our offices were closed at this time. When our offices reopened to the public, the counter representations were available for inspection.

Submission of documents for independent examination

20.—(1) Before a council submits a development plan document to the Department under section 10, it must consider representations made under regulation 16 and, as the case may be, regulation 18.

(2) The documents prescribed for the purposes of section 10(3) are—

(a) the report under section 8(6)(b) or, as the case may be, section 9(7)(b),

(b) the statement of community involvement,

(c) evidence that the council has complied with its statement of community involvement,

(d) copies of the notices referred to in regulation 10(a)(iv), 15(a)(iv), and 17(1)(a)(iii), (e) the timetable,

(f) a statement setting out—

(i) a summary of the main issues raised in representations made in accordance with regulation 11(2), and

(ii) how those main issues have been taken into account in the preparation of the development plan document;

(g) a statement setting out—

(i) if representations were made in accordance with regulation 16(2) or 18(2), the number of representations made and a summary of the main issues raised in those representations, or

(ii) that no such representations were made;

(h) copies of any representations made in accordance with regulation 16(2) or 18(2), and

(i) such supporting documents as in the opinion of the council are relevant to the preparation

of the development plan document.

(3) The council must also send to the Department—

(a) where the development plan document is a plan strategy, a copy of that plan strategy, or

(b) where the development plan document is a local policies plan-

(i) a copy of that local policies plan, and

(ii) a copy of the adopted plan strategy.

Regulations 20 – Submission of documents for independent examination (1) Has the Council carefully considered all representations made under regulation 16 and regulation 18?

of the development plan document;

(b) the places referred to in paragraph (a) are—

(i) the council's principal offices, and

(ii) such other places in the district of the council as the council considers appropriate;

(c) notify the consultation bodies of the fact that the development plan document and the

documents mentioned in paragraph (a) are available for inspection and the places and

times at which they can be inspected;

(d) notify any person who has made (and not withdrawn) a representation in accordance with

regulation 16(2) or 18(2) of those matters; (e) give notice in the Belfast Gazette and by local advertisement of the fact that the development plan document has been submitted to the Department; and (f) publish the notice mentioned in paragraph (e) on its website.

Regulation 21 – Availability of submission documents

August 2020
1.0 Introduction

- 1.1 This revised timetable sets out Mid Ulster Council's program for the production of its local development plan (LDP) and includes details of the key stages in the process. The timetable will help ensure that the plan process is efficiently managed and that the key stakeholders such as the consultation bodies and the Planning Appeals Commission (PAC) are kept informed and can manage their own resources to facilitate their involvement in the LDP process. In relation to public consultation this timetable should be read alongside the Mid Ulster Statement of Community Involvement.
- 1.2 Under Section 7 of the Planning (Northern Ireland) Act 2011 a council has a duty to prepare, and keep under review, a timetable for the preparation and adoption of the local development plan. Sections 8(4)(a) and 9(4)(a) require both the Plan Strategy and Local Policies Plan to be prepared in accordance with the timetable.
- 1.3 **Regulations 5 to 8** of **the Planning (Local Development Plan) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2015** (LDP Regulations) sets out the requirements for the preparation, form and content, agreement and availability of the timetable.

2.0 Purpose and Status of the Local DevelopmentPlan

- 2.1 The purpose of the Mid Ulster Council Local Development Plan, comprising the Plan Strategy and Local Policies, is to inform the general public, statutory authorities, developers and other interested bodies of the policy framework and land use proposals that will implement the strategic objectives of the Regional Development Strategy and guide development decisions within Mid Ulster District Council up to 2030.
- 2.2 The preparation of the LDP will take account of the Council's Corporate Plan and Community Plan so that there is a shared vision for the council area and communities and it will set out the long-term social, economic and environmental objectives for the district. The LDP will also take account of regional policy context set by the Northern Ireland Executive and Central Government Departments. This includes, amongst others, the Sustainable Development Strategy, the Regional Development Strategy, the Strategic Planning Policy Statement and Planning Policy Statements.
- 2.3 The Mid Ulster Local Development Plan will replace the Cookstown Area Plan 2010, Dungannon and South Tyrone Area Plan 2010 and the Magherafelt Area Plan 2015. The Plan will be produced in two stages consisting of two separate documents, which will shape development within our district in the period to 2030. The first stage will be a Plan Strategy followed by Local Policies Plan.
- 2.4 Prior to the preparation of the Plan Strategy and Local Policies Plan the Council will identify the key issues in the plan area and will formulate a series of options for dealing with them. This information will be published as a

Preferred Options Paper which will indicate a Council's preferred options for growth and development in their area and will be the basis for consulting with the public and stakeholders who will have an opportunity to put forward views and influence the local development plan from the outset.

- 2.5 The Plan Strategy will establish the strategic direction of the plan in order to provide a level of certainty on which to base key development decisions in the area as well as the necessary framework for the preparation of the local policies plan. The Strategy will set the aims, objectives, overall growth strategy and associated subject policies applicable to the Plan Area.
- 2.6 The Local Policies Plan (LPP) will be consistent with the plan strategy. In contrast to the Plan Strategy the LPP will deal with site specific policies and proposals associated with settlement limits, land use zonings and environmental designations required to deliver the council's vision, objectives and strategic policies. Prior to the publication of the Local Policies Plan (LPP) the Council will publish a Local Policies Plan 'Key Issues' Paper identifying the key issues in the area and will provide the public with the opportunity to comment them to inform the preparation of the LPP. The document will outline key issues such as settlement limits, location of housing and economic development land within the towns, town centre boundaries etc. and invite comments on them.
- 2.7 A Sustainability Appraisal (incorporating Strategic Environmental Assessment) of the Local Development Plan will run in parallel with the preparation of various stages of the plan and will be an ongoing process. The purpose of the Sustainability Appraisal is to promote sustainable development through the integration of social, environmental and economic considerations into the preparation of the Local Development Plan. Reports from the various stages of the Sustainability Appraisal will be published at the key stages of the plan preparation as detailed in the Timetable at Appendix 1.

3.0 Timetable of Actions

- 3.1 The Mid Ulster Local Development Plan revised Timetable is set out at Appendix 1. In accordance with Regulation 6 of the Planning (Local Development Plan) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2015 the Timetable contains <u>indicative</u> dates for the various stages of the plan preparation process.
- 3.2 The timetable details the various actions at the key stages of the preparation of the Plan. The timetable also includes those actions that also relate to the Sustainability Assessment and other assessments that are required to be carried out in the preparation of the plan including a Strategic Environmental Assessment, Habitats Regulations Assessment and Equality Impact Assessment.
- 3.3 In accordance with **Regulation 5 of the Planning (Local Development Plan) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2015**, in preparing the timetable, consultation has been undertaken with the Planning Appeals Commission (PAC) and key consultation bodies.

3.4 There are a number of factors that may impact on the delivery of the Local Development Plan within the indicative timescales indicated. Annual monitoring of the plan will take place and a report will be produced to inform Members and the Department on progress in meeting the timetable and on the land availability for housing and employment. In the event that progress is not in line with the timetable the Council has the power under the Planning Act 2011 to publish a revised timetable.

4.0 **Project Management**

4.1 Meeting the attached timetable is dependent upon Member involvement, adequate resourcing of the Local Development Plan, brokering agreement with neighboring councils and risk management.

Member Involvement

- 4.2 To date members have made the following key decisions:
 - In September 2016 the Council agreed the Preferred Options Paper. This was published in November 2016 and subject to a 12 week public consultation period.
 - Following consideration of the representation and other evidence the Council agreed the Draft Plan Strategy with accompanying Sustainability Appraisal (incorporating SEA) on January 2019.
 - The draft plan and accompanying documentation was published February 2019 and subject to an 8 week consultation. The representations were then published and subject to an eight week period to allow for counter representations.
- 4.3 Prior to taking a Council decision on submission of the Plan to the Department, an error in the advertisement procedures was identified, resulting in the need to repeat the consultation exercise. The re-consultation period was set for a period of 8 weeks commencing in March 2020 and closing in May 2020. Due to the COVID19 pandemic, the consultation closing date was suspended. In July 2020 Notice of a new closing date in September 2020 was issued. An 8 week period will then be allowed for counter representations.
- 4.4 Members will then make the following key decisions:
 - In Winter of 2020-21 having considered any representations, the Council will decide whether they wish to submit the Plan to the Department for independent examination. (If they choose not to, the timetable will need to be amended.)

- By Spring of 2022 the binding report of the Department should have been presented to the Council for adoption of the Plan. The Council will also decide on the Public Consultation paper for the Local Policies Plan, where if required a call for sites in particular sites will be issued.
- In Winter of 2022/23 the council will decide on publication of the Sustainability Appraisal (incorporating SEA) and Draft Local Policies Plan.
- In Summer 2023 the Council will decide on submitting the Plan with any representations to the Department for an Independent Examination.
- In Autumn 2024 the binding report of the Department will be presented to the Council for adoption of the Plan.

The first stage will be a Plan Strategy followed by Local Policies Plan.
- 2.4 Prior to the preparation of the Plan Strategy and Local Policies Plan the Council will identify the key issues in the plan area and will formulate a series of options for dealing with them. This information will be published as a Preferred Options Paper which will indicate a Council's preferred options for

growth and development in their area and will be the basis for consulting with the public and stakeholders who will have an opportunity to put forward views and influence the local development plan from the outset.

- 2.5 The Plan Strategy will establish the strategic direction of the plan in order to provide a level of certainty on which to base key development decisions in the area as well as the necessary framework for the preparation of the local policies plan. The Strategy will set the aims, objectives, overall growth strategy and associated subject policies applicable to the Plan Area.
- 2.6 The Local Policies Plan (LPP) will be consistent with the plan strategy. In contrast to the Plan Strategy the LPP will deal with site specific policies and proposals associated with settlement limits, land use zonings and environmental designations required to deliver the council's vision, objectives and strategic policies. Prior to the publication of the Local Policies Plan (LPP) the Council will publish a Local Policies Plan 'Key Issues' Paper identifying the key issues in the area and will provide the public with the opportunity to comment them to inform the preparation of the LPP. The document will outline key issues such as settlement limits, location of housing and economic development land within the towns, town centre boundaries etc. and invite comments on them
- 2.7 A Sustainability Appraisal (incorporating Strategic Environmental Assessment) of the Local Development Plan will run in parallel with the preparation of various stages of the plan and will be an ongoing process. The purpose of the Sustainability Appraisal is to promote sustainable development through the integration of social, environmental and economic considerations into the preparation of the Local Development Plan. Reports from the various stages of the Sustainability Appraisal will be published at the key stages of the plan preparation as detailed in the Timetable at Appendix 1.

3.0 Timetable of Actions

- 3.1 The Mid Ulster Local Development Plan revised Timetable is set out at Appendix 1. In accordance with Regulation 6 of the Planning (Local Development Plan) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2015 the Timetable contains <u>indicative</u> dates for the various stages of the plan preparation process.
- 3.2 The timetable details the various actions at the key stages of the preparation of the Plan. The timetable also includes those actions that also relate to the Sustainability Assessment and other assessments that are required to be carried out in the preparation of the plan including a Strategic Environmental Assessment, Habitats Regulations Assessment and Equality Impact Assessment.

 - The Sustainability Appraisal (incorporating SEA) and Draft Local Policies Plan will be presented to Council in Summer 2021 for authorisation of publication.
 - Council authorisation will be sought in Winter 2021/2022 to forward the Plan with any representations to the Department to request an Independent Examination. Any counter representations will be forwarded eight weeks later.
 - Council authorisation will be sought in Autumn 2022 on whether to accept or rebut the representations and submissions made to the Independent Examination by the date set.

• The binding report from Department will be presented to Council to allow adoption in Winter 2022/2023.

I am writing with reference to the above matter. The purpose of this correspondence is to consult on our Revised LDP Timetable in accordance with Regulation 7 of the Planning (Local Development Plan) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2015 and on our Revised SCI in accordance with Regulation 6 of the Planning (Statement of Community Involvement) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2015.

Both the attached revised LDP Timetable and revised SCI were agreed by resolution of full council at their meeting on 25th October 2018.

Looking firstly at the revised LDP Timetable I would draw your attention to the fact that we have consulted with the Planning Appeals Commission (their response is attached) and the following consultation bodies: Invest NI, Historic Environment Division, NIHE, NI Water, DFE/GSNI, Natural Environment Division, DfI, TNI Western Division, DfI Rivers. Of those consultation bodies who responded no objections or issues have been raised.

The main change to the revised timetable is to reflect the amended indicative timescales for the next stages of the LDP process. It is worth noting that we have added an additional stage into our LDP process - Public Consultation on Key Issues for Local Policies Plan (8 week consultation) – and this has been reflected in the timescales for the subsequent stages.

With regard to the revised SCI the main change is the introduction of the additional stage prior to the publication of the LPP – the key issues consultation stage. We feel that this is an important step beyond the legal requirements to ensure that our community are engaged during the entire plan making process, and given the length of time that will have passed between the POP and the LPP. The other change to note in the revised SCI is the removal of any reference to the development plan documents being available on CD or disc. Our reason for this is that CDs are extremely difficult to source when printing and many people no longer have disc drives on their computer hardware and we had no specific requests for them at the time of our POP consultation. We had considered an alternative of providing a pen drive but many organisations are unable to open these. We therefore feel that hard copy and availability on line either by pdf or map viewer, or both, will cater for all those who wish to participate.

It is also worth mentioning that the community groups listed at Appendix 1 of the SCI has changed as we undertook a communication exercise with them in relation to GDPR legislation to ensure that they wished for their details to be held. This exercise resulted in a reduction in many of the organisations on the list. Of course if organisations wish to be added in the future allowance is made for that in the SCI.

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Next Sunday 9 June the Church celebrates the outstanding Feast of Pentecost, regarded as the beginning of the life of the Church. Faith Matters uses the reflection from Real-ity, the Redemptorist publication. The Feast of Pentecost, like Easter, takes us back to our Jewish roots. The Jewish com-munity began to celebrate it at sunset yester-day. They call it Shavuot, the Feast of Weeks. It occurs 50 days after Passover, and com-memorates the giving of the Law on Sinai. Like Passover, it was a pilgrimage feast when Jews came to Jerusalem. The New Testament has two different ways of describing the gift of the Holy Spirit - the dramatic events described in today's first reading or the more gentle image of Jesus breathing the Spirit into his disciples which we find in the alternative Gospel for today.

which we find in the alternative Gospel for today. "When he says, 'In the evening of that same day, the first day of the week' (John 20:19), John is referring to Easter Sunday. The Spirit is Jesus' Easter gift to his community. Unexpect-edly, he enters the closed room where his dis-ciples are hiding. There are none of the great signs of the coming of the Spirit we read in the first reading - no tongues of fire, no great wind shaking the house. Instead, Jesus 'breathes on them'. That word is used three times in the Old Testament. First, in the creation story God breathed into the face of the clay figure he had

made from the dust of the earth, and it became a living being (Genesis 2:7). Second, Elisha the prophet restores a boy to life by breath-ing three times on him (1 Kings 17:17:24). The third is when young Tobias cures his father's blindness by rubbing his father's eyes with the gall of a fish, breathing on them and so restor-ing his sight. Breathing on someone is like a new creation, a resurrection and a restoration of vision. of vision.

new creation, a resurrection and a restoration of vision. "Luke's account of the day of Pentecost in Acts is very rich. That extraordinary list of nationalities '(1) Parthians. (2) Medes and (3) Elamites; (4) people from Mesopotamia, (5) Judaea and (6) Cappadocia, (7) Pontus and (8) Asta, (9) Phrygia and (10) Pamphylia, (11) Egypt and (12) the parts of Libya round Cyrene; (13) residents of Rome – Jews and proselytes allke – (14) Cretans and (15) Arabs' (Act 2:9-11) encompasses 15 countries that stretch from the Mediterranean to the Persian Gulf. They have come to Jerusalem for the pilgrimage feast of Shavuot. For Luke, Pentecost is not just a Jewish feast but the inauguration of the Christian mission that is meant to transform the world. In one of my favourite novels, The Diary of a Country Priest, a wise and experi-enced old priest tells a nervous young curate lacking in confidence that the Gospel is meant to be the light of the world, we have turned it into a bedside lamp for Christians."
